(*Capacity Improvement and Advancement for Tomorrow)

As of 2016-December-07

1. Situation Analysis

1.1. Current Situation

Coastal Area is an area which generally has the rate change the most significance compared with other areas in one whole watershed system. This is due to the land use, which is quite in line with the socioeconomic activities in that area and also others effects as a result of the activities conducted in the upstream area.

Most of the coastal areas in Indonesia suffered an environmental degradation, particularly in the Jakarta Area as the Capital, which has also included in the delta region, where the main urban economic activity developed in many coastal areas (North Jakarta).

As the delta region, Jakarta has declined an environmental quality and vulnerability of floods, both floods caused by the overflow of the river (south region) and tide/rob (north region).

In order to reduce the vulnerability of flood and solve the environmental degradation problems in Jakarta, it has been many programs and activities that performed and initiated either by the Central and Local Government which is one of them is National Capital Integrated Coastal Development (NCICD) Program. The development of NCICD Program is expected could be used as a lesson learn to solve all of problems on the water - coastal development in Indonesia.

In connection with the NCICD Program that will be used as a lesson learn to solve all of problems on the water - coastal development in Indonesia, thus in the implementation of this program, requires a knowledge management so that all data and information which are needed and used could be managed, documented, and disseminated as well.

1.2. Problem or Opportunity Analysis

NCICD Program is a complex program of an integrated water – coastal development, which needs a careful planning and implementation, due to the potentially has a big impact on environmental and socioeconomic issue and many interrelated stakeholders should be involved.

In terms of the acceleration of the implementation NCICD Program, The Indonesian Government has given special attention by entering this program in the medium-term development plan documents (period 2014 – 2019), where on the other hand is currently also being compiled the legal basis for its implementation.

At the end of 2014, the Government of Indonesia has completed NCICD Master Plan, but it is still required more advanced studies to be able to get into the overall implementation phase.

Nowadays, central government (Ministry of Public Works and Housing) and local government (Provincial Government of DKI Jakarta) are completing Stage A of the NCICD Program, which is strengthening the existing wall (river and coastal). This phase is expected to finish by the end of 2018.

By paying attention, of the many opportunities that arise in terms of the development of this program, which is one of these is the commitment of the central and local governments to work together to resolve it, and moreover, with the lessons learned from other countries such as The Korean Government which has succeeded in developing a similar program such as Saemangeum Development Project, hopefully this program could be planned and implemented as well.

In order to knit these opportunities, the Knowledge Management System (KMS) needed to be made, so that it could be used as a tool for formulating a policy to accelerate the implementation of NCICD Program. To perform its function, since we have many stakeholders with the different function and roles, thus we requires Human Resources with adequate competency and capacity as well as deep understanding and strong analytical on public policy matters, either theories or current best practices. It would be very valuable for us in providing

qualified analysis and recommendation to the Executive (Minister and President/Vice President), and also in order to coordinating others related stakeholders.

1.3. Justification for KOICA's Intervention

The Korean Government (KOICA) and the Indonesian Government had good cooperation since long time ago in terms of development and implementation on Integrated Water Resources Management. At the early August 2016th, we have signed a trilateral cooperation as outlined as Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) of NCICD Program Indonesia.

We also find that the Korean Government has a success story on made the longest sea dikes on the world and also has an integrated plan of water – coastal development which is the Saemangeum Development Project.

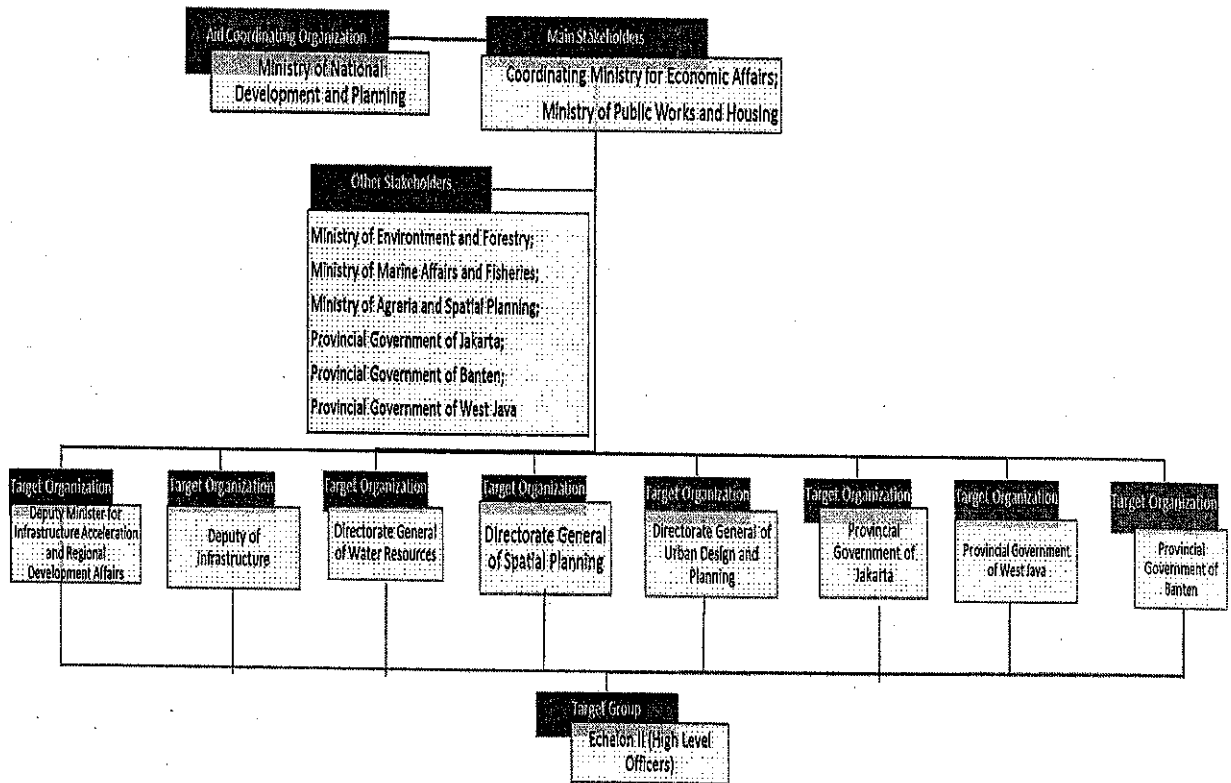
